# Registration Information

## Pre-Registration

Pre-registration is preferred. The “early-bird” registration fees (prior to **March 29, 2003**) are **\$700** (didactic only) and **\$1,500** (didactic and lab) for MDs, PhDs, & DOs; **\$500** (didactic only) for fellows,\* residents,\* (\*with Letter of Introduction from Program Director) and other health-care professionals. In order to qualify for the discounted “early-bird” registration fees, the CME office must receive both the registration form and payment by **March 28, 2003**.

As of **March 29, 2003**, the “regular” registration fee will be raised to **\$800** (didactic only) and **\$1,700** (didactic and lab) for MDs, PhDs & DOs; **\$600** (didactic only) for fellows,\* residents,\* (\*with Letter of Introduction from Program Director) and other allied health care professionals. In order to qualify for the “regular” registration fee, the CME office must receive both the registration form and payment by **May 1, 2003**.

## On-Site Registration

*There will be an additional processing fee for on-site registration, so meeting participants are encouraged to take advantage of advance registration.*

The fees for the postgraduate course will be **\$850** (didactic only) and **\$1,750** (didactic and lab) MDs, PhDs and DOs; **\$650** (didactic only) for fellows,\* residents,\* and other health-care professionals (\*with Letter of Introduction from the Program Director).

All the different fee structures include course syllabus and other related hand-out materials, continental breakfast, refreshment breaks and lunch.

## One-Day Attendance

You may also register for one day of the conference. On the registration form, please indicate which day you are choosing. One-day registrations shall be accepted for the date of the indicated session. Any unusual combination ie, one afternoon followed by one morning session of the next day will not be permitted.

The pre-registration fees will be **\$400** (didactic only) for MDs, DOs, PhDs for one-day and **\$300** (didactic only) for fellows,\* residents,\* and other health-care professionals (\*with Letter of Introduction from the Program Director) for one day.

*The one-day fee for on-site registration will be raised by \$50.*

## Registration Confirmation

Each participant who sends in the required documentation (registration form and payment) by **April 23, 2003** will be sent a confirmation letter.

## Refund Policy

Your registration fee is refundable, less a \$60 administrative charge if *written cancellation* is received on or prior to **April 23, 2003**.

**Absolutely no cancellations will be honored after this date.**

Refunds are mailed within four to six weeks after the conference.

*No-shows are not eligible for a refund.*

## Substitution Policy

If you register for, but cannot attend the conference, you may substitute another individual within your organization. **A substitution must be made in writing to the CME Office at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center before April 23, 2003.**

However, if the substitution is made at the time when a different registration fee is in effect, you will be assessed the difference between the earlier fee and the fee at the time of the substitution registration.
